# Rugby - Team Reports and Results

## ROUND 2 VS SPC – SATURDAY, MAY 11, 2019

### 1st XI Football Vs St Pats: Result 48-0

It was a fitting way to finish a strong weekend of rugby results against SPC with the 1st XV running out winners 48-0. In an effort that saw the team score eight tries it was the defensive effort of the boys to hold another opposition to zero points that really stood out. This will be important for the team moving forward with many tough games to come. Strong efforts by Josh Radford, Campbell Moller and forwards Lachlan Howse and Harry Clements.

<b>3rd XV</b>	The 3rds recorded a solid win against a depleted SPC team. Tim Gibbs won MVP for his 3 try haul. The forwards played well but were penalised for poor ruck skills and have been challenged to do better.
<b>5th XV</b>	A much-improved team performance for our internal game against the 6ths. It was a close encounter for the entire match, with the mighty 5ths scoring a late try resulting in a 24-19 win. Nick Fisher was exceptional scoring 1 break away try and setting up another.
<b>9A</b>	The team played with real purpose this week after a solid week of training. The support play for the forwards was first class. The backline attacked brilliantly through excellent straight running and sharp passing.
<b>9B</b>	Improving performance with better structure and support in attack. With the forwards dominating the scrums and lineouts the backs had good ball in attack out wide. Winger Tom Peacock ran in 4 of our 11 tries. Looking forward to an even more polished performance next week.
<b>9 GREEN</b>	A Luke Porst special off the centre field set piece allowed for an early try. A lack of composure at critical moments of the game were costly. Ultimately the scoreboard didn't reflect the team's performance. Will be looking to bounce back in weeks to come.
<b>8B</b>	Out of the blocks with intent, line speed in both defence and attack has been improving. We have recognised that Rugby is a team game, the boys are building with that special performance looming.
<b>8C</b>	Strong opening start for the boys. Solid five minutes of pressure lead to good field position and a try. Following that the boys started to struggle after Iona put some play together. A very unfortunate injury stopped the and cancelled the game
<b>8 WHITE</b>	Poor start by Marist. SLC come out switched on with a few early tries in the first half. Marist lowered try rate in the second half, however was a poor defensive effort.
<b>7A</b>	Very good team performance with bits of individual brilliance.
<b>7B</b>	The B's played strongly as a team, with a great defensive effort.
<b>7C</b>	Boys played a really good game, they were able to use the space presented to them really well. Looking to improve ruck work before this weekend's clash.
<b>7 GOLD</b>	The boys had a great game against a higher-level team. Had some great running in the open field by multiple players. Forwards did great in securing possession. Unlucky loss but still promising signs.
<b>7 WHITE</b>	The boys played well as a team. Working on ball retention and use of backline. Padua were short players so a few of our boys played on their team. Thanks to everyone who put their hand up.
<b>6A</b>	The forwards won the early encounters to give the 6A team the momentum early, but this was not to be a walkover. In what was a seesawing match the lead changed on numerous occasions. Sean Green found plenty of space out wide to set-up one try and score an individual effort. Courageous forward defence held tight to secure the victory.
<b>6B</b>	The boys showed up ready to play and produced a complete team effort. Lead by Lachie Vink the 6Bs we're firing, the forwards dominated their opponents and the backs used that momentum to pile on the points. An impressive all-round performance that should give the boys confidence for the remainder of the season.
<b>6C</b>	The boys continue to show improvement in all aspects of the game, some great combinations are starting to form and the boys are looking to build on a great start to the season. Special mention this week to Harry Wood for scoring a great solo try.
<b>6 GOLD</b>	When Padua was a no show the boys played an exhibition game of Rugby7s. They played extremely well, under difficult circumstances, racking up an amazing 70 points between them. The team have finally found their rhythm, working together to get the ball out to the wing and across the try line. Well done boys!
<b>5A</b>	Down 5-22 at halftime, Ashgrove's 5As came out firing in the second half, eventually seizing momentum in a seesawing encounter. Barnstorming runs from Jonah Wilde and James Gissing gave the team confidence while desperate defence and a never-say-die attitude saw the boy's home 36-22 in a highly entertaining come from behind victory.
<b>5B</b>	The 5B's started their season in tremendous fashion with a dominant display over St Pat's. The boys got away to an early lead through their tenacious defence and eagerness to win the ball in the ruck, which was the defining factor in their performance. The two wingers; Ky Campbell and William Easter left the field with six tries between them and is a true indication of the ability to work as a team and shift the ball to the outside backs. The forwards were dominant in the ruck and the backs were excellent in making their passes stick to find space out wide. Fantastic overall effort from the B's.
