From the Head of Sport

Last weekend we travelled away to St. Laurence's College (SLC) for Round 3 of sport that began with our Chess teams on Friday evening. On Saturday SLC hosted 70 sporting fixtures in a huge day of sporting competition that also doubled as their annual SLC "Old Boy's day". With huge numbers of students, staff and parents from both Colleges in attendance, it was a fantastic day for both communities, and we thank SLC for their tremendous hospitality in hosting the day.

As usual, the competition between our two Colleges reflected many decades of close rivalry and was played in the extremely competitive and positive nature of competition that we expected. We commend our students on contributing to this great sense of school spirit by displaying positive levels of behaviour throughout the day.

Since those opening runs we've had almost 200 boys participating in cross country training and that depth of participation is one of the great strengths of our program. Our success at the past three AIC Championships is simply not possible without the support of the entire squad competing and pushing each other at training and practice race meets. It's a credit to the quality of our group that squad selections were so incredibly difficult this year, and everyone who ran at any time this year from the Maccas runs to now should take pride in being a part of our championship team.

One of the great highlights of this year was hosting our first 'open' training session late in term 1. We know and celebrate how hard the boys work when they get on the track; however, it's easy to overlook the people who are dragging them out of bed, getting them ready for school and driving them to training at a very antisocial time of day. So it was an absolute treat to offer parents, carers and families the opportunity to get involved, have a laugh enjoying training and in some cases wipe the floor with the boys during one of our typical sessions. Following up with a hot breakfast made for a fantastic end to the morning, and the only negative was that we dramatically underestimated the turnout which basically meant there was quite a bit more bacon in the breaky sandwiches for those who ate first compared to those eating last. The positive response from boys, families and coaching staff makes this event a lock to become a regular fixture in the XC calendar in coming years.

Looking ahead to next year, the AIC XC season will remain a Term 1 & 2 sport, however, the championships will not only be pushed back to later in Term 2 but also return to the familiar locale of Limestone Park, Ipswich. As with this year, formal training sessions will commence early in Term 1, and camp will be held during the subsequent school holidays. In the meantime, the possibility exists for reigniting the running club through the winter, although this will depend on student interest.

In closing, a final thank you to all who have been a part of the MCA XC program this year. The positive, supportive and competitive culture is a credit to the College and all the boys and staff who have driven the sport in previous years. We bid farewell to a terrific group of seniors this year, and at the same time welcome a new group of leaders to step up from the junior ranks to lead the team to continued success.
