## From the Head of Sport

The final round of the Term 2 sporting season was held last weekend and in a showdown between two of AIC's biggest sporting Colleges it was a fitting way to finish the season. Term 2 is arguably one of the busiest when considering our student participation with 76 teams and over 1100 students involved. We were very proud to have some very well-organised, competitive and exciting weekends of sport this year that had both communities involved in providing memorable experiences for our students.

Last Saturday we hosted the final round of senior sport against Iona and after a competitive round, many premierships and our overall standings in the AIC competitions were determined. Across all AIC Colleges, competition continues to improve to challenge the ongoing dominance of Ashgrove sport. Aggregate championship winners are determined by the overall performance of our A and B teams from Year 7-12, and in both codes, our teams performed very well.

With a strong performance across the season and an even final round of results, we managed to wrestle the aggregate rugby shield back from Iona College. Full credit must go to Iona for creating a strong rugby rivalry with us and a strong program where their junior teams will certainly be forces to reckon with in the future. We hope that a healthy and competitive contest will continue in this sport for many years.

That being said, one of the key pillars of the Ashgrove community is integrity and we always try to operate with this in mind in everything we do. Regardless of results, premierships and final standings this is something that all members of our community strive to uphold. When in competition our College will always aim for excellence as do all AIC Colleges but of more importance is that throughout this term, we have continued to uphold our high standards of sportsmanship despite what may be occurring around us. We congratulate all students, coaches and families on this.

In a season of many highlights, the success of our undefeated 1st XV rugby side in claiming the third 1st XV premiership in a row with a final round 55-12 victory over Iona was a big highlight. This was coupled with the brilliant performance of our 1st XI side who secured their premiership on Saturday with a 3-0 win. In a close competition the 1st XI team were exceptional all season and thoroughly deserved this result.

We were elated to welcome the 1st XI boys on to McMahon Oval to celebrate their premiership arm-in-arm with the 1st XV in front of a large and appreciative crowd. With the growing strength of programs at AIC this is a rare feat and it was fantastic to see both teams receive their well-deserved accolades in front of our College community and a large number of Old Boys positioned outside the Cyprian Pavilion.

## ROUND 7 VS IONA – SATURDAY, JUNE 15, 2019

### 1ST XV RUGBY VS IONA: RESULT 55-12 WIN

An exceptional start to the game saw the boys get out to a 31-0 lead before an error was made. With this start they had stamped their authority and the game continued to flow from there. In front of a big crowd and several returning years of Old Boys at the Cyprian Pavilion this was a performance reflective of the deserved AIC premiers. Another hard-working effort from several unsung heroes in the forward pack, that was a trademark of this season, saw Will Michelmore receive a deserved man-of-the-match.

<b>2nd XV</b>	The final round saw the 2nd XV challenge themselves to dictate the pace of the proceedings against Iona. With a frenetic start to the game the players found themselves struggling to maintain accuracy with the speed of play they had created. Five-eighth Harry Whitten was superb with steadying the ship to allow the team to get on the front foot and play some rugby, Darcy Hammond once again was huge with his efforts carrying the ball and scrummaging by dominating the opposition in both facets of the game. The team saw some of their hard work rewarded with an accumulation of tries throughout the game. A note of recognition must go to Billy Packer for his superb all-round performance for a second week in a row, never looking out of place whilst adding value to the forward pack. A tough finish to the undefeated season, not playing our best rugby but getting the vital win with flashes of what the team could do with ball in hand and defence. Well done boys!!
<b>3rd XV</b>	Opens 3rd XV played a grand final against Iona who were also undefeated. A close game at halftime saw MCA narrowly in front 15-12. Marist ran away with the game in the second half 35-12. Tim Gibb scored a hat trick, Matt Hogarth came back from injury, Chris Mahony came in from the wing and Harry Lyons stepped up in a team depleted by flu. Ben Lanigan capped off a sterling season.
